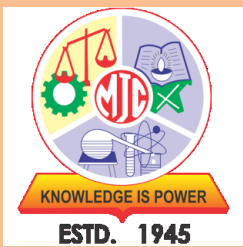

Concept note

We can hardly think without words. Better vocabulary widens your horizons of knowledge and makes you a better thinker. Henry Hazlitt states that “A man with a scant vocabulary will almost certainly be a weak thinker. The richer and more copious one’s vocabulary and the greater one’s awareness of fine distinctions and subtle nuances of meaning, the more fertile and precise is likely to be one’s thinking. Knowledge of things and knowledge of the words for them grow together. If you do not know the words, you can hardly know the thing.” Our vocabulary becomes our personality and our character. Aldous Huxley states that “Words play an enormous part in our lives and are therefore deserving of the closest study.” But study, for most of the students, is not an interesting activity. This competition intends to create interest among students about learning new words and improve their communicative strength.

A good vocabulary improves the necessary language skills - listening, speaking, reading and writing. Having adequate vocabulary helps us to express ourselves clearly and fluently. Using the right words in their right context makes one an effective communicator. This competition intends to sensitize and encourage the students to enhance their word power and their communicative strength. Words are the building blocks of language and the more words one knows a better and fluent speaker one becomes. The word list prescribed for the competition contains 1500 important and frequently used words of B1 and B2 level from The Oxford 3000™ by CEFR level. Studying these words will definitely improve participants' active vocabulary. This competition hopes to make learning words a joyful activity because few activities are as delightful as learning new vocabulary.
